

Tear-Off Exemption Policy

Exemption Requirements by Licensee.

- For an exemption to be granted, the following requirements must be met;
 - The Licensee is to provide a written request for the exemption,
 - The Track Licensee must have an Environmental Policy outlining the collection and disposal of tear-offs in place,
 - Information regarding the exemption including the relevant information from the Environmental Policy must be published in the Supplementary Regulations of each event,
 - Provision must be made for the collection and disposal of discarded tear-offs, i.e., used or discarded tear-off bins or collection points are in place around the venue, track and pits,
 - Consideration for the future phasing out of tear-offs

RCB & Officials Procedure

- The RCB are to ensure the Environmental Policy contains information that meets the following criteria:
 - Details of the locations of tear-off disposal points (bins) around the venue,
 - Details of the clean-up process post-event,
 - Appropriate measures for the misuse of tear-offs by participants,
 - Consideration for the future phasing out of tear-offs - There is a possibility in the future that Tear-offs are banned by law for environmental reasons, so Licensees and RCB's need to consider this moving forward.
- The above information must be included in the Supplementary Regulations of any event that is to be held at the venue.
- Approved Licensees will have the exemption listed on their Track License by the RCB.
- Track inspectors may carry out audits to ensure Licensees that have been granted an exemption comply with the above requirements. The RCB may terminate the exemption upon a failed audit by the track inspector.
- The appointed Steward of an event may conduct random audits of the Licensee's Environmental Policy at the request of the RCB, to ensure the above points have been adhered to.
- The appointed Steward will be required to comment regarding the audit on their Steward's report for the meeting. The RCB may terminate the exemption upon a failed audit by the Steward.
- The Licensee may choose to terminate the exemption at any time.
- The exemption is valid for the term of the license, unless the RCB or the Licensee find it necessary to terminate earlier.
- Supercross events held on temporary tracks are automatically exempt due to the extensive clean-up already required post-event with tearing down the track and cleaning of general litter. It is at the discretion of the RCB to automatically apply this exemption.
- State and local legislation may override this exemption where applicable.
