



YAMAHA 24Hr TRIAL 2009 ENTRIES FILLING FAST !

With this year's Yamaha 24Hr trial coming up fast and having the number of riders limited to 200 riders are getting their entries in early to secure their spot in this year's event. The committee have found that we are getting most interest we have ever had from interstate riders wanting to come and have a try at Australia's ultimate reliability test with 20 interstaters already locked in.

With this event being run over 12 competitive stages ranging from 3Kms to 15Kms throughout the 250Km lap ridden four times this event gives the riders such wide and varying terrain and conditions that you are hard pressed to find in any other event. Last year's winner and 10 times champion Kawasaki's Shane Diener saying "It's one of the best events in Australia for sure, if not the world, as it's so unique, not only is it mentally and physical draining but bike preparation is a huge factor. To ride at night also adds to the challenge and working on your bike in the darkness isn't easy. It's the biggest buzz when you're wide open through a special section at 1am and there's a huge camp fires and everyone's cheering you on, nothing beats that. It's not only riding fast for one special section but for the whole 24 hours, consistency is the key and not wrecking yourself or your bike".

Kawasaki's Shane Deiner is one of the many riders already to enter this year's event along with 2008 3rd place getter New Zealand's Yamaha rider Chris Power, New South Welshman Craig Douglas as well as SA young guns Rhyce Ahola and Shaun Blenkiron who have been showing some great speed at the first 2 events of the year. The sidecar field to is looking like being a hotly contested class with 2008 winners Christopher Schultz/ Stuart Gerhardy and past winners Shane Schiller/ Steven Doecke already locking there entries in.

24Hr committee member Brett Tomkins had said "We are working on a number of changes for this year's event as requested by sponsors, riders and spectators to continue to improve this event, one being every section timed to the second. With different terrain & the Eudunda community getting behind the event we are aiming to make it a must do event for 2009 and beyond."

Another change for this years event is the inclusion of section sponsors where we are allowing companies to sponsor one of the 12 sections in return gaining the naming rights and promotion from that section.
